

How to Ride: Fixed Route Public Transit







- 1. After determining your route and departure time, be at the nearest bus stop at least 5 minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive.
- As the bus comes down the street, check the destination sign to make sure it is the route number and destination you want. Signal the bus driver with a wave of your hand to indicate you want to board.
- 3. Climb aboard and let the driver know where you would like to get off.
- 4. If you will be transferring to another transportation service, let your driver know and they will make your connection as smooth as possible.
- 5. One block from your stop, tell the driver where you need to get off. Drivers of fixed route buses are instructed to announce stops at the following:
 - Transfer points with other fixed routes
 - · Major intersections or destination points
 - Sufficient intervals along a route to orient a passenger with a visual disability to his or her location
 - Any stop requested by a passenger with a disability
- 6. Check to make sure you haven't left anything behind, then exit.
